1776 <u>Declaration of Independence</u>



We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness. - That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed, - That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness.





1787 <u>Drafting of the U.S Constitution</u>





in Order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defense, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America. ART I § 1 All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives AMD I Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances. AMD II A well regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed AMD IV The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no Warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by Oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized. AMD V No person shall be held to answer for a capital, or otherwise infamous crime, unless on a presentment or indictment of a Grand Jury, except in cases arising in the land or naval forces, or in the Militia, when in actual service in time of War or public danger; nor shall any person be subject for the same offence to be twice put in jeopardy of life or limb; nor shall be compelled in any criminal case to be a witness against himself, nor be deprived of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor shall private property be taken for public use, without just compensation.

1561-1626 Francis Bacon: empiricism, scientific method, revolution **1636** <u>Harvard</u> first colonial college, conformed to tenets of Puritanism 1647 Old Deluder Satan Act towns hire schoolmaster to teach children 1600s Christian denominations established most early colleges to train ministers. They were modeled after Oxford and Cambridge, and other universities in England and Scotland.

1783 after the American Revolution, colleges began to broaden their focus to include education for the ministry, medicine and law. 1800s Students drilled in Greek, Latin, geometry, ancient history, logic, ethics, rhetoric; include "practical subjects" like agriculture and engineering; modern languages.

Laissez-faire: policy of minimum governmental interference, particularly in the economic affairs of individuals and society; government has a role only in enforcing contracts and ensuring civil order. Stay free with: limited powers, checks and balances, innocent until proven guilty.

The Sexual Revolution '60s-'80s

- Challenged traditional codes of behavior related to sexuality and interpersonal relationships throughout the U.S. and subsequently, the world.
- Increased acceptance of sex outside of traditional heterosexual, monogamous marriage relationships.
